

### Beginning Colored Pencil Techniques

1. 48 set of Prismacolor Colored Pencils
2. Stonehenge Drawing Paper – 11” X 14” pad, or similar - Strathmore makes a good paper in this size.
3. Kneaded eraser
4. Pencil Sharpener - battery powered or hand held (Staples has inexpensive battery powered sharpeners; so does Dick Blick and Daniel Smith. For hand-held, go with KUM)
5. #2 graphite pencil
6. Large soft brush (drafting brush, 2” paintbrush from Ace)
7. Empty jar (for storing pencils when in use)
8. Scrap of terry cloth towel, or roll of paper towels

#### Optional:

1. A drawing board -- larger than your paper. Boards with clips are available from Dick Blick, Daniel Smith, Cheap Joes and other on-line suppliers. The local Daniel Smith and Artist and Craftsman Supply also have these. An alternative would be Gatorboard - a very stiff foam-core board.
2. A Burnishing Pencil -- Prismacolor makes these; they're not overly expensive.
3. Tracing Paper -- Large enough to handle an 8” X 10” drawing
